

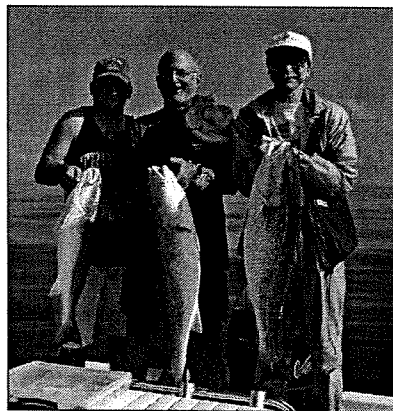

Why Louisiana?

- Louisiana leads the Nation in crude oil production
- Impact of oil and gas industry on the economy of Louisiana was \$93 billion in 2001
- Sports fishing and coastal tourism contribute \$3.7 billion to the Louisiana economy per year
- Over the last decade, about 20% of US oil spills were reported in Louisiana

What is Natural Resource Damage Assessment?

- Objective: Restore environmental harm caused by oil spills
- Natural resource trustees represent the public interest
 - Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality
 - Louisiana Department of Natural Resources
 - Louisiana Wildlife and Fisheries
 - Louisiana Oil Spill Coordinator's Office
 - US Department of the Interior
 - US Department of Commerce (through NOAA)

Legal Underpinnings

- Oil Pollution Act of 1990
 - Trustees must assess damages and restore, replace, rehabilitate, or acquire the equivalent of natural resources injured by oil spill incidents
- Oil Spill Prevention and Response Act (revised 2001)
 - Establish a state-wide program under Louisiana Oil Spill Coordinator's Office
 - Make damage assessments more efficient
 - Coordinate with state natural resource trustees

Activities to Date

- Trustee Workgroup meetings started January 2000
- Informal Scoping
 - More than 15 meetings from October 2000 through spring 2001
- Formal Scoping – June 2001
 - Public Review Document issued for public comment
 - Notice of Intent to develop a PEIS
 - Six public meetings held
 - Established Administrative Record (www.darp.noaa.gov)

National Environmental Policy Act

- Proposed Action: Establish and Implement the Regional Restoration Planning Program
- Describing proposed actions to the public
- Public input on proposed actions
 - Public comment period runs May 9 through July 9
 - Public meetings

Louisiana Regional Restoration Planning Program

- Objectives of the Program
 - More restoration after oil spills
 - Faster restoration after oil spills
 - Lower cost of restoration planning process
 - Combine restoration projects to promote larger, more ecologically significant restorations
 - Reduce uncertainty by improving understanding of the damage assessment process
 - Increase public participation during pre-spill planning

Louisiana Regional Restoration Planning Program

- Program features outlined in DPEIS
 - Management structure
 - Natural resources that may be injured
 - Restoration types
 - Linkage between injured resources and restoration types
 - Decision criteria
 - Settlement alternatives
 - Implementation process

Louisiana Regional Restoration Planning Program

- Regional Restoration Plans
 - Nine regions in Louisiana
 - Listing of potential restoration projects
 - Establishment of unit costs for principle restoration types

- Trustees will consider comments and finalize PEIS
- Develop and release of Regional Plans for public comment
